


Workforce Development Across the EDLA

What's Going on in the WFDP?

The Workforce Development Open House is hosted every 1st and 4th Wednesday of the month from 9am - 12pm. Clients may schedule an appointment or walk-in for assistance. Clients will be able to build resumes, search for employment, take part in mock interviews, and participate in weekly workshops. Topics to be covered are:

- -Help! My Resume Needs a Makeover!
- -What the employer wants to hear
- -Certifications vs Workforce Readiness Programs
- -Should I follow up with the employer and how?
- -How to Dress for Success

The Dress for Success program will instruct clients on what is the proper attire to wear to interviews. A Dress for Success video will be created and played on the monitor in the lobby. It will showcase staff modeling the proper attire when going to job interviews.
